JOINT PROGRAMMING (Definition)

- Member States engaging
 - voluntarily and on a variable geometry basis
 - in the <u>definition, development and implementation</u> of <u>common</u> <u>strategic research agendas</u>
 - based on a <u>common vision</u> on how to address <u>major societal</u> <u>challenges</u>.
- It may involve <u>collaboration</u> between <u>existing national programmes</u> or the <u>setting up of entirely new ones</u>.
- It entails putting resources together,
 - > selecting or developing the most appropriate instrument(s), and
 - > collectively monitoring and reviewing progress.



Joint Programming in Research

Council Conclusions on Joint Programming

Criteria to identify Joint Programming themes:

1. Sufficient and effective commitment of Member States;

2a. The theme addresses a European/global (major societal) challenge ...

- 2b. ... is sufficiently focused so that...
- 2c. ... clear and realistic objectives can be laid down and followed-up;
- 3. Clear added value to existing situation in research financing;
- 4. Relevant stakeholders have been involved;

5a. A JP approach has potential for output of public good research into benefits for European citizens/-EU Competitiveness...

5b. ...and of increasing efficiency and impact of public R&D financing by..

5c. ... involving the key public initiatives in the area.

Commission prepares proposal for Council Recommendation on the basis of themes identified by the Joint Programming Group



Council adopts Recommendation, launching the selected Initiatives

Setting up of management structures, development of visions, drafting of the Strategic Research Agendas, pooling the resources, analysis of the potential of existing instruments or the need for new ones. Commission supports as deemed necessary.



Implementation. Launch of first joint activities, first report to Council





Conclusions of the Communication: Key actions towards a coherent European Agricultural Research Agenda

1. Towards a more sustainable agriculture in the global context

2. New priority areas for the future Agricultural Research Agenda

- Climate change and agriculture under the perspectives of adaptation and mitigation -> CWG

- Agriculture and energy and the specific research needs resulting from their mutual interaction -> CWG

3. Strengthening the agricultural knowledge production and sharing in Europe

4. Consolidating joint research programming for better governance of the European agro-food system

- 5. Developing a mechanism for foresight monitoring
- 6. The responsibility of Europe in a globalised world

JPAR WORKSHOP "Towards joint programming in European agricultural research" Brussels, 4 June 2009

- **COM** "Towards Joint Programming in Research" foresees a new impetus towards a more strategic approach to coordination and collaboration in the programming of public research within the ERA
- The SCAR **foresight process** paved the way to the preliminary identification of 3 priority research themes suitable for the JP requirements
- Participants: programme managers, SCAR-WG members, experts from selected major research institutes throughout Europe

Parallel sessions

- 1. Agriculture and Climate Change: Adaptation & Mitigation
- 2. Food, diet, health and prevention of metabolic diseases
- 3. World food security and supply
- The participants were requested to highlight the connection between related major challenges and **specific criteria** required by the JP procedure (JP template)
- These reflections fed into the preparation of **3 draft proposals for JP initiatives** to be submitted to the SCAR plenary on 16 June 2009 ("simulation exercise")



SCAR position paper on JPAR SCAR plenary 16 June 2009

Discussion on the SCAR strategy in support to GPC members

- "Agriculture and Climate Change" topic already in the form of an advanced draft proposal (with strong input from related CWG), but all topics need further development.

- Adoption of a **position paper on JPAR combining the 3 topics**:

- Agriculture and Climate Change: Adaptation and Mitigation
- Food, diet, health and prevention of metabolic diseases
- World food security and supply
- Informal transmission from SCAR delegates to national homologues in GPC (before the GPC meeting 23/06), with the aim to demonstrate that considerable preparation is going on in the SCAR countries for the launch of a possible JPI, and also provide information about the directions and interest.
- SCAR-WG was given the mandate to decide upon any further message to be given to the GPC


