



How to develop economically?

Milk Expansion as a route to County economic growth

- In 2010, the elected members of Kilkenny County Council approved an economic development plan for Kilkenny, which identified agri-business as a path to economic development.
- A Working Group of Senior Executives of major agri-business companies was established which identified milk expansion as a principal route to agri-business growth.
- A Scientific Working Group was established from the relevant state agencies inc TEAGASC to model for Kilkenny, as a test case, the growth in cow herd numbers arising from milk expansion, and to model the impacts on water quality.
- In October 2012, the Scientific Working Group recommended that a collaborative approach would be needed, involving agri-industry, local authorities, TEAGASC, farmers and farm bodies, and community groups to address and overcome sustainability challenges.

County and Regional Structures

- Kilkenny elected representatives reviewed agri business strategy on a regular basis
- Agri-business adopted as a regional growth strategy by the Regional Authority
- Water and waste water strategic infrastructure put in place for major industry inc agri.
- Third level Colleges in region put greater focus on agri and agribusiness with a particular focus on information technology/precision agriculture



- Significant role for Teagasc in accelerating routes to sustainability


