
- Budget ~700 kEUR










The advantages of a COST Action

- facilitating access to research infrastructures
- fostering opportunities for training
- creating open spaces for the free circulation of researchers and ideas
- increasing interconnectedness with the whole research community
- stimulating international mobility and visibility
- boosting careers of young researchers







Participation in COST Actions has led to significant results and follow-up in terms of the number of proposals submitted for collaborative research in Framework Programmes, with a success rate which more than triple the average success rates for these programmes (37% success rate).



What options are there to invite Inclusiveness target countries?


Requisite for a COST Action: at least 1/3 ITCs

Important for EU funding!



- Expect a year to develop a good proposal
