

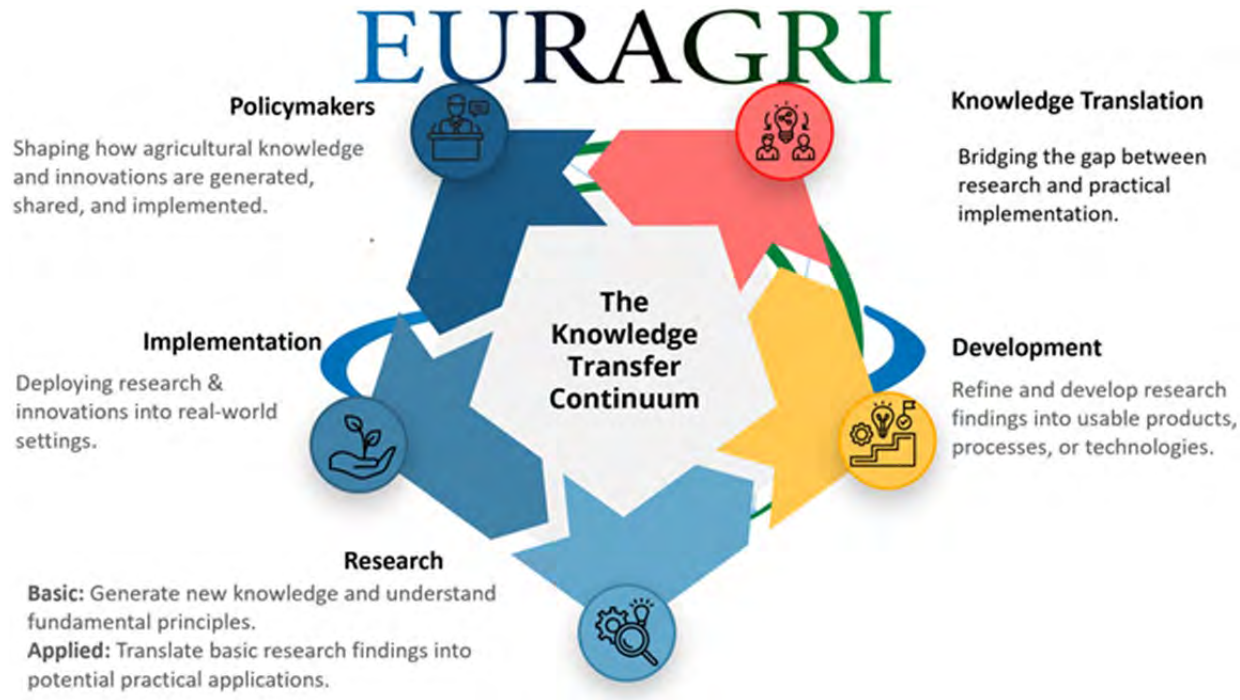

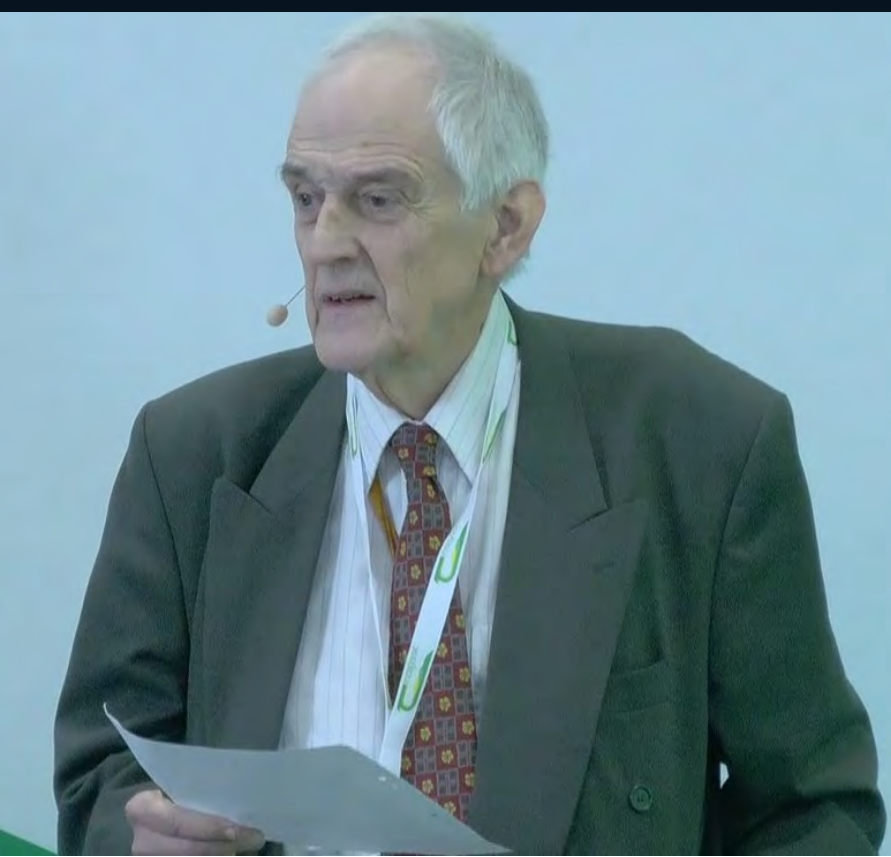
Euragri – who are we?

EURAGRI is built on the strength of its members — 15 leading institutions from across Europe who bring together research excellence, policy insight, and practical experience in agriculture, food, forestry, and natural resource management.

Ten of our members are from research and education institutions, while five are from national government departments in agriculture and food. This unique mix of public service, scientific expertise, policy leadership, and diverse plural actors gives EURAGRI its distinctive role within the European landscape. Our shared focus is clear: to contribute to the investigation, innovation and policies for sustainable farming and food systems aligned with the UN Sustainable Development Goals and the ambitions of the European vision.

In the first quarter of 2025, EURAGRI's visibility and influence have grown — a reflection of our network's strength and relevance. Our selection as one of 29 organisations invited to participate in the EU Strategic Dialogue on the Future of Agriculture marks our credibility and standing. It was followed by the valuable insights generated from our December workshop, Reflections on the EU Strategic Dialogue I was honoured to deliver the keynote address in March 2025 at the MED seminar in Portugal on the future of the agri-food sector. Uno, EURAGRI’s president, provide an overview of the process and results of the European Union’s Strategic Dialogue on the future of agriculture. He emphasised:

- The need for a wide-ranging debate, drawing attention to the tensions between the rural and urban worlds and the critical need to overcome the differences between the plural actors in the agri-food sector.
- The crucial role of innovation and digitalisation, the need for food security and Europe’s strategic autonomy, and the 10 Strategic Dialogue’s principles, including the urgency of change, cooperation in the agri-food chain and valuing rural areas.

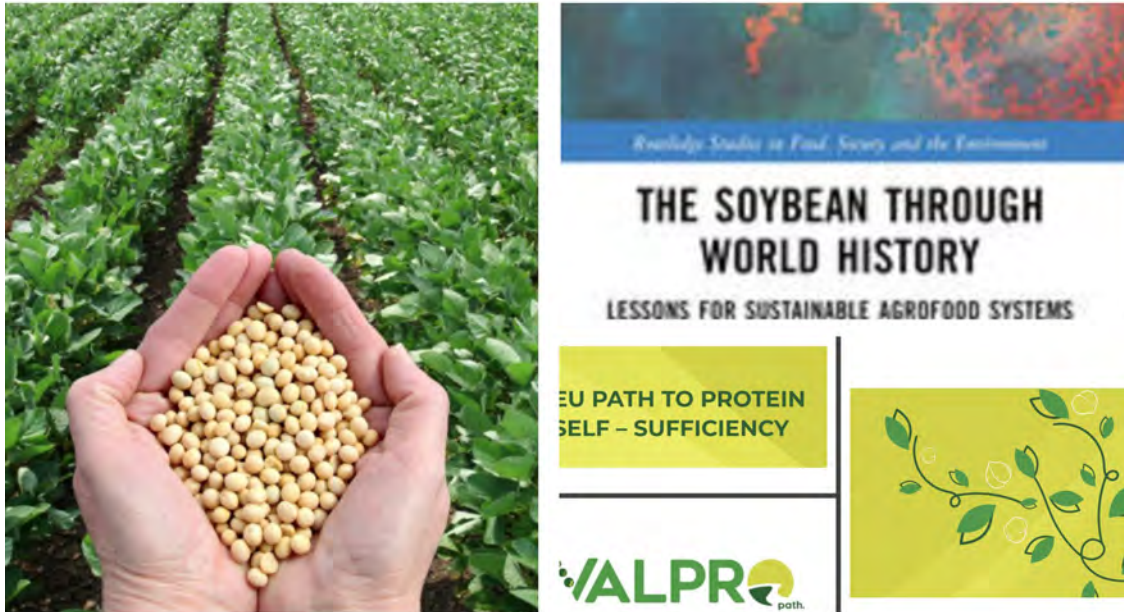
